He said, the country is witnessing 20 billion transactions worth 25 lakh crore rupees through UPI every month. United Kingdom Prime Minister Keir Starmer said that UK and India are natural partners and global leaders in fintech.



The District Development Coordination and Monitoring Committee (DISHA) meeting for Zunheboto was held yesterday. Chairing the meeting, Member of Parliament and DISHA Chairperson, S. Supongmeren Jamir, urged officials to work in close coordination with the district administration to ensure that central welfare schemes reach the grassroots. He stressed that no beneficiary should be left out and called for addressing local challenges in project implementation. The MP also appealed to officials and councilors to plant at least one tree during their tenure in the district. Presentations were made by DRDA, PHED, and the Social Welfare Department. Zhimo. A case has been registered at East Police Station and investigation is underway.

GST Bachat Utsav, which was announced by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, and commenced on 22nd of last month, is benefiting all sections of society. Today, our correspondent brings a report on the GST reforms that will boost the economy of the state of Arunachal Pradesh.

The new GST reform is a major boost for Arunachal Pradesh's artisans, farmers, and small businesses. Under the revised structure, many goods in the state will now attract only 5 percent GST instead of the earlier 12 or 18 percent. Agricultural and processed food items, such as juices and jams, which were earlier taxed at 12 percent, are now taxed at 5 percent. Apart from this, the GST rate on processed forms of ginger has been reduced from 12 percent to 5 percent, making pickled products around 7 percent cheaper. Similarly, handicraft goods and traditional textiles produced by local artisans now attract a 5 percent tax. The next generation GST reforms aim to make products more affordable for consumers and lift margins for producers.

In view of the recent assessments by road safety and geotechnical experts, the Tsiedukhru stretch of National Highway 29 has been declared highly fragile.

In this regard, authorities have issued new restrictions on the movement of multi-axle vehicles which will now be strictly regulated with immediate effect until the conditions stabilize. We have a report-

Multi-axle vehicles on the Tsiedukhru stretch of NH-29 will be allowed only between 10 AM and 5 PM, under traffic police supervision. Speed is limited to 20 kilometers per hour, with proper spacing between vehicles. Overloaded trucks are banned, and vehicles above 30 tonnes will not be allowed. The Transport Department and NHIDCL will support traffic police in checking loads and clearing any blockages. Officials have warned that traffic will be stopped immediately if slope movement is detected. Drivers are also advised to stay alert for falling debris and to cooperate fully with enforcement personnel.
