Nagaland's Tourism Minister Temjen Imna Along has spotlighted Dzükou valley as a key focus for world-class tourism development. Speaking at the ongoing State Tourism Ministers Meet in Udaipur, Rajasthan, he emphasized the valley's pristine landscape and cultural significance. Noting that Dzükou valley attracts the highest number of tourists from across the country, Mr Along stressed the need for sustainable tourism, resisting mass road construction to preserve the valley's natural integrity.

The Minister proposed Dzukou Valley as the State's nomination under the 'Development of 50 Tourist Destinations of Global Standards' initiative. The proposal envisions a transformative development plan of 250 crore rupees, including construction of a eco-friendly luxury hotel, other tourist facilities and supporting infrastructure to enhance accessibility and visitor experience while preserving the valley's natural eco-system. Acknowleging support from the central government, he said the state is advancing in the tourism sector, including in spiritual and eco-tourism. Mr Along urged for engaging expert consultants to shape Nagaland into a globally recognized destination.

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh has approved a hundred per cent increase in financial assistance for Ex-Servicemen and their dependents under schemes implemented by the Department of Ex-Servicemen Welfare. The penury grant has been doubled from four thousand rupees to eight thousand rupees per month per beneficiary. This will provide sustained lifetime support to aged and non-pensioner Ex-Servicemen and their widows above 65 years of age with no regular income. The Ministry said, the education grant has been increased from one thousand to two thousand rupees per month per head for up to two dependent children. The marriage grant has also been raised from 50 thousand to one lakh per beneficiary. The Ministry said, the revised rates take effect for applications submitted from 1st November this year onwards

Nagaland Police has urged all driving licence holders and registered vehicle owners to ensure their mobile numbers are updated on the Parivahan and Sarathi portals. In a public notice, the police informed that vehicle owners can add or update their mobile numbers through an Aadhaar-based authentication process by visiting parivahan.gov.in. A pop-up window will display two links - vahan.parivahan.gov.in/mobileupdate/ and sarathi.parivahan.gov.in/sarathiservice/mobNumUpdpub.do for updating mobile details. The police advised that the same mobile number linked with Aadhaar must be used for both portals. All updates should be completed by October 23, after which fines and penalties will be imposed during checking. The police also reminded that defaulters must always ask for official receipts when fines are imposed.
