NEWS IN ORDER:-

PM:

Prime Minister Narendra Modi said that employment fairs have become a medium for fulfilling the dreams of the youth of the country. The Prime Minister said this in a video message at the 17th National Rozgar Mela in New Delhi yesterday. During the event, appointment letters to more than 51 thousand to newly recruited youth in various Government departments and organisations are being distributed under the Rozgar Mela initiative. Mr Modi said, through these employment fairs alone, more than 11 lakh appointment letters have been given to young people in the past some time.

ROZGAR MELA:

The 17th edition of the Rozgar Mela was held yesterday at the State Convention Centre, Shillong, as part of the nationwide initiative to provide employment opportunities to the youth. More than 58 youths were handed over appointment letters across various Central Government departments, including 16 candidates in the Department of Posts, 3 in NEEPCO, 2 in the CRPF, 27 in the Railways, and 10 candidates in State Bank of India. Union Minister of State for External Affairs & Textiles, Pabitra Margherita, graced the occasion as the Chief Guest. In his address, Pabitra Margherita recalled attending the 15th edition of the Rozgar Mela at the same venue six months ago and lauded the continuing enthusiasm among the youth of Meghalaya.

COMMISION:

The National Human Rights Commission (NHRC), in view of the cold wave in the country, has urged 19 state governments and 4 Union Territories Administrations to take pre-emptive steps and implement relief measures for the protection of vulnerable segments. These segments include newborns, children, the elderly, and the homeless, who are at risk due to a lack of shelter and resources. Highlighting National Crime Records Bureau data

about the reported deaths of three thousand six hundred thirty-nine people between 2019 and 2023 due to exposure to cold waves, the Commission reiterated the National Disaster Management Authority's guidelines to mitigate the effects of cold waves. In astatement, the NHRC informed that it also reiterated the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) guidelines to mitigate the impacts of cold waves, in its communication with states and UT administrations. These guidelines include establishing treatment protocols, setting up day and night shelters, providing medical care and implementing standard treatment procedures for cold-related illnesses among others. The Commission also acknowledged that changing weather patterns due to climate change affect human rights.

HARVEST:

In Manipur, as the harvesting season has begun and security measures have been intensified in all fringe and sensitive areas to avoid any unwanted incident between two communities. Meanwhile, the District Administration, Bishnupur has declared that harvesting activities in fringe areas of the district will be conducted from 6.30 AM to 4.00 PM to allow adequate security coverage during these hours and informed all farmers of the concerned areas to strictly comply with the scheduled time. The Deputy Commissioner of Bishnupur district, Pooja Elangbam, IAS yesterday chaired a security meeting held at the district headquarter which focused on ensuring smooth conduct of harvesting activities in fringe areas and early rehabilitation of Internally Displaced Persons. The meeting was attended by key officials of the districts including officers of police and various central forces.

DEPORTATION:

Mizoram Chief Minister Pu Lalduhoma has reiterated his administration's commitment to deport all Non-Mizos residing in the state without valid Inner Line Permit documents. Speaking at the 75th Central YMA General Conference. The Chief Minister said he recently held discussions with Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Union Home Minister Amit Shah regarding the deportation of Non-Mizos from Mizoram. Lalduhoma emphasized that the state government's policy aims to prevent cultural assimilation and safeguard Mizo identity, noting a recent increase in the number of Non-Mizos staying in the state without proper ILP documentation. The Chief Minister reminded attendees that the ILP system has been in place since the British colonial era and continues to serve as a safeguard for the Mizo community.

HEALTH:

Tripura Chief Minister Dr. Manik Saha yesterday inaugurated the 8th phase of the state-level "Sustha Shoishob Sustha Kaishor Abhiyan" (Healthy Childhood, Healthy Adolescence Campaign) at Teliamura Town Hall. The campaign will continue till November 6. Under this phase, medicines will be administered to a total of 10,59,182 children and adolescents aged between 1 and 19 years. A new feature — the U-WIN platform — has been introduced in this phase to generate ABHA (Ayushman Bharat Health Account) IDs for children. The Chief Minister said that the objective of the campaign is to ensure the healthy growth of children and adolescents — physically, nutritionally, and cognitively — and to control anaemia among them. He also stressed the importance of timely vaccination and preventive medication for children and adolescents to keep them disease-free. Dr. Saha elaborated on the steps taken by the state government to strengthen health services in Tripura. Government Chief Whip Kalyani Roy also spoke at the programme.

COMMISSION:

A Central Water Commission (CWC) report highlighted Glacial lakes and other water bodies in the Himalayan region have expanded by 9.24 per cent over the past 14 years, spotlighting the effects of climate change. The total inventory area of glacial lakes and water bodies increased from 5.30 lakh hectares in 2011 to 5.79 lakh hectares in 2025, it said. The Monthly Monitoring Report by the commission keeps track of water bodies in the Himalayan region. Its August iteration, which is yet to be made public, noted that shrinking glaciers and the expansion of glacial lakes have become some of the most visible signs of global warming in the region. The CWC said 1,435 glacial lakes and water bodies showed an increase in their water spread area, while 1,008 recorded a decrease over the 14-year period. The report said the commission monitors 2,843 glacial lakes and water bodies using high-resolution Sentinel satellite data through Google Earth Engine.

SWIMMING:

The 1st All Shillong Interschool Swimming Championship 2025, organised by True North Fitness Centre and Swimming Academy, began today here at the Lapalang centre. The event is a two-day championship at True North's indoor heated swimming pool, with over 155 students from 25 schools across the capital city taking part, backed up by friends, family and well-wishers cheering them on in an atmosphere of healthy competition. The first day was flagged off by Keith Syiemlieh, the senior-most member of True North Centre. Day 1 witnessed enthusiastic competition from all schools, especially between St Edmund's, St Anthony's, Assam Rifles Public School (Sports), Khasi Jaintia Presbyterian Girls HS School, Seven Set School, Pine Mount School, Loreto Convent and others. Twenty-six events, including the 100m freestyle, 100m breaststroke, 50m backstroke, grueling 200m individual medley, were conducted yesterday for both boys and girls.

RUN:

To commemorate 'Infantry Day', Spear Corps under the aegis of the Indian Army in collaboration with Run Monks is organising the Infantry Adventure Run (5 km, 10 km & 21 km runs) at Aalo in West Siang district of Arunachal Pradesh. Scheduled for 27th Oct next, the adventure run aims to symbolise unity, fitness, adventure and Nation Building. The Indian Army has urged the public to register themselves and be a part of the Infantry Adventure Run.

DAY:

Deputy Chief Minister of Arunachal Pradesh, Chowna Mein yesterday flagged off the Walong Cycling Expedition commemorating the 63rd Walong Day from the premises of the Golden Pagoda in Namsai. Describing the expedition as more than just a sporting event, the Deputy Chief Minister said it represents a continuation of the proud legacy of bravery, endurance, and patriotism. While paying solemn tribute to the brave martyrs who made the supreme sacrifice defending the nation during the 1962 Indo-China War, Deputy Chief Minister said that, "In the most challenging conditions, our soldiers courageously confronted the Chinese forces, scripting a glorious chapter in our military history". Mein also saluted the unparalleled courage and patriotism of the Indian soldiers. To further honour the region's rich military history, the Deputy Chief Minister mentioned the upcoming Second World War Museum at Jairampur in Changlang district, marking the 80th anniversary of the Second World War.
