#### **BSF**

In an indication that more and more youths of the state are inclined towards serving the nation, the recent Border Security Force (BSF) recruitment drive in Meghalaya received an overwhelming response, with the force getting a whopping 25,000 applications from aspiring candidates. Inspector General (IG) of BSF Meghalaya Frontier, OP Upadhyay, informed that out of the 25,000 applications received, around 15,000 youths participated in the physical efficiency test (PET). Out of these applicants, 7,000 of them have qualified for the written examinations," the IG said, adding that the declaration of results is in an advanced stage and will be announced soon .Encouraged by the enthusiastic participation of the youths, the BSF IG said he would recommend to the central government to conduct more recruitment drives in Meghalaya, its border areas, and across the entire Northeastern region. Meanwhile, the Border Security Force has also undertaken a comprehensive vulnerability mapping of sensitive stretches along the Meghalaya-Bangladesh border to curb incidents of trans-border crime and intrusion by Bangladeshi miscreants. Upadhyay said that the overall situation along the international border remains largely satisfactory although the internal situation in Bangladesh continues to be sensitive.

#### ARUNACHAL

#### **DIDIS**

Tripura Chief Minister, Dr. Manik Saha on Saturday inaugurated the "Lakhpati Didi" programme under the 'Samriddhi' project at Rabindra Bhavan, Agartala. The initiative, launched by the Tripura Rural Livelihood Mission, aims to empower rural women by distributing Rs 100 crore as community funds to create one lakh "Lakhpati Didis." Speaking on the occasion, Dr. Saha said that strengthening the socio-economic foundation of rural women is vital for the nation's development. He added that the state is moving towards a Developed Tripura in line with the Central Government's Viksit Bharat vision. The Chief Minister highlighted that women now have 33% reservation in government jobs and 50% of stalls in government markets. Over 1.77 lakh women have received social security pensions, while thousands have benefited from welfare schemes like Matru Pushti Uphar and PM Matru Vandana Yojana.

A solemn memorial service marking the 35th Death Anniversary of Meghalaya's first Chief Minister, Late Capt. Williamson A. Sangma, was held in Tura yesterday.
