Prime Minister Narendra Modi has said that the conspirators behind the horrific incident in Delhi will not be spared and all those responsible will be brought to justice. Addressing an event in Thimpu, Bhutan, Mr Modi said, he was in contact with the agencies involved in examining this incident entire night yesterday. He assured that the agencies will go to the very bottom of this conspiracy. The Prime Minister said, today, he has come to Bhutan with a very heavy heart and the incident in Delhi last evening has deeply disturbed everyone. Mr Modi said, he understands the pain of the affected families and the entire nation stands with them. A powerful blast which took place in a Hyundai i20 car at a traffic signal at around 7 pm, near Red Fort in Delhi killed eight people and injured several others yesterday evening.
