Advisor for School Education and SCERT, Dr. Kekhrielhoulie Yhome, today emphasized the power of imagination and diverse realities in education. He was addressing an Art Exhibition in Kohima organised by the School Education Department in collaboration with Saturday Art Class, a non-profit educational organization from Mumbai. Dr. Yhome highlighted the importance of imagination in shaping how we perceive the world, noting that it plays a crucial role in the learning process. Referring to the recently held Project-Based Learning Fair in Chümoukedima, he noted that students were able to express issues like bullying through their art, showing how creativity enables communication beyond words. He also underscored the vast potential of self-expression through art.

The Advisor commended the Saturday Art Class for training 120 teachers across 60 government schools in Kohima district, and expressed hope for a five-year Memorandum of Understanding to continue the collaboration.



MLA Jwenga Seb today highlighted ancestral values, emphasizing resilience, hard work, honesty, and unity as enduring principles to guide society. Speaking on the second day of the Tokhü Emong festival in Wokha, he urged the community to preserve the natural environment and use resources responsibly, noting the forefathers practiced conservation even without formal education. Expressing concern over growing divisions within society, civil bodies, and among national workers, Mr Seb appealed for unity and collective efforts to

overcome tribal barriers and strengthen harmony. The second day of the festival witnessed indigenous games like spear throw and tug of war.



Advisor for Social Welfare, Wangpang Konyak has announced plans to establish an Old Age Home in every district of Nagaland. Addressing the Eye camp for Senior Citizens at District Hospital, Mon today, he reaffirmed the department's commitment to uplifting vulnerable groups, including the elderly, by providing social assistance, meeting nutritional standards, and protecting those at risk. He highlighted government schemes such as the Old Age Pension, Elderly Helpline, and Charity Care. The programme was jointly organised by the Social Welfare Department and Mercy Eye Centre Dimapur supported by District Hospital, Mon.



Nagaland Police have issued a stringent public warning against spreading misinformation related to the murder of Vihozhonu Zao, which occurred on October 24. In an advisory, Police noted a surge of fake news and unverified claims circulating online, and cautioned all social media users, content creators, and media outlets against fabricating information. Calling such actions serious criminal offense under the IT Act and Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, it said, violators will face arrest, prosecution, and imprisonment. The public is explicitly warned against sharing unverified content, spreading baseless theories, naming or accusing individuals not identified by investigators, and inciting communal hatred. Authorities urge citizens to verify information through official sources, report false posts, and respect the victim's family's privacy.



Members of the Indian Women Cricket team, winner of the ICC Women's Cricket World Cup 2025 called on President Droupadi Murmu at Rashtrapati Bhavan in New Delhi today. President Murmu congratulated the team and said that they have created history and have become role models for the younger generation. The President added that the team represents different regions, social backgrounds, circumstances and reflects India as a team.



Director General of Akashvani, Rajeev Kumar Jain, is on a two-day visit to Kohima, marking his first official visit to the state. During his visit, he will interact with officials and staff of Akashvani Kohima, and review the station's

functioning, and ongoing broadcasting initiatives. This evening, he inspected the FM studio set up and Regional News Unit section. Tomorrow, Mr Jain will hold a review meeting with the officers of section heads.
