Uttarakhand is celebrating its 25th State Foundation Day today. On the occasion of the state's Silver Jubilee, Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated and laid the foundation stones for various development projects worth more than ₹8,000 crore at a programme held at Forest Research Institute in Dehradun. Mr Modi launched a commemorative postal stamp to mark the occasion today. The Prime Minister also released a support amount of ₹62 crore to more than 28,000 farmers directly into their bank accounts under the PM Fasal Bima Yojana.

Chief Minister Pema Khandu today declared open the Annual College Week Celebration of Dera Natung Government College at Itanagar. In his address, the Chief Minister lauded the college for its remarkable contribution to higher education over the last 46 years. Khandu informed, the government will provide 100 percent scholarships to APST youth securing admission to undergraduate and postgraduate courses at IITs and top 150 global universities of Q.S. Ranking. Further, 75 percent scholarship for obtaining Commercial Pilot Licenses and merchant navy training certificates to 10 each aspiring youths every year. He further said, the government has approved for sociology and mass communication departments in the college. Khandu urged for immediate construction of the infrastructures for it before new academic session. He also directed the local legislator and the deputy commissioner to look for a suitable site to establish a new college in Itanagar.

Chief Minister Pema Khandu interacted with the Yak Herders delegation from Ladakh, Sikkim, Arunachal Pradesh, Nepal and Bhutan today at Itanagar. During the meeting, the Yak Federation of India was constituted after collective deliberation. It has been recognized as a new generic record for India and its findings were published in the international journal 'Taiwania' on Saturday. Similarly, another team earlier discovered two rare plants namely 'Hoya Chinghungensis', which has been documented in India for the first time, and 'Hoya Acuminata', newly recorded from Arunachal Pradesh. It was discovered from East Kameng, Pakke Kessang and Longding districts.
