Prime Minister Narendra Modi has said that India's space sector is becoming an attractive destination for global investors. Speaking at the inauguration of Skyroot's Infinity Campus through video conference, Mr. Modi highlighted that the government has undertaken several historic reforms in India's space sector. He said the government has opened the space sector for private innovation, enabling startups and industry to work closely with the country's scientific ecosystem. Mr Modi highlighted that in the coming years, the global space economy is set to grow manifold and will open tremendous new opportunities for young people of the country.

Chief Minister Pema Khandu today inspected the Kitpi small hydro electric station Phase-I, the oldest hydel project in Tawang district, originally built in 1977. The plant has now been upgraded with modern infrastructure and the test run is currently in progress. CM Khandu shared in a social media post that the plant will be dedicated to the public very soon, marking another step forward in strengthening our local power infrastructure.

Arunachal Pradesh Chief Secretary Manish Kumar Gupta today chaired the 14th Senior Officers' Meeting to review the overall progress of key Government programmes and reforms, including major Budget Announcements, SASCI-related actions, compliance-burden reduction, implementation of SNA SPARSH, and the status of the Digital India Land Records Modernisation Programme, In this connection, the three Divisional Commissioners were asked to closely monitor progress in their respective divisions.

Arunachal Pradesh Minister for Home and Inter State Border Affairs, Mama Natung today attended the Indian Council of Historical Research sponsored National Seminar on "Temple Heritage and Sacred Places of Worship of the Janjatis of North East Bharat: A Voyage through Time, Art, Sculpture, Architecture and Traditions", in Guwahati. The Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI) has deactivated over two crore Aadhaar numbers of deceased individuals as part of a nationwide clean-up effort to maintain the continued accuracy of the Aadhaar database. The Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology said that UIDAI sourced this data from the Registrar General of India, States and Union Territories. It added that no Aadhaar number is ever reassigned to another individual.

Upper Siang DC Talo Jerang along with SP Token Saring and EE RWD Gatling Lipir, inspected the 43 km Jido-Palling PMGSY road yesterday. This Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana road project, being executed by the Yingkiong RWD Division, aims to connect Palling CO Headquarters with Tuting Sub-divisional Headquarters, passing through Jido, Angging, Singging, and Palling villages.

A five-day Capacity Building-cum-Workshop on Cooperative Rejuvenation was organised from 21st to 26th November in Itanagar by the State Department of Cooperation, in collaboration with Tribhuvan Sahkari University, Gujarat, to boost the cooperative sector. The event covered cooperative governance, entrepreneurial thinking, business plan preparation, and strengthening dairy and fisheries societies, besides the need for effective inter-departmental convergence.

An upcoming weightlifter from Arunachal Pradesh, Golom Tinku won the gold medal in the men's 60kg weight category at the Khelo India University Games, Rajasthan 2025 held in Bikaner, on Tuesday. Representing Lovely Professional University, Golom lifted a total of 256kg to clinch the gold.

Tage Rimu won bronze medal at International Health, Sports and Fitness Festival (IHFF) of Amateur Olympia India Mumbai 2025 held in Mumbai from 21st to 23rd of this month. Rimu hails from Mudang Tage Village, Ziro in Lower Subansiri district.

Anshuman Tripathi, member of the Empowered Committee on Hi-Tech Manufacturing and former member of The National Security Advisory Board, led a series of talks on "Misinformation and Social Media" at the North Eastern Council (NEC). The sessions were attended by Som Kamei, Planning Advisor, NEC, and other officials, focusing on challenges in the digital information space and cognitive warfare.
