Arunachal Pradesh Chief Secretary Manish Gupta Participated in the Audit Run this morning, from Bank Tinali to Mowb-II, organised by the Office of the Accountant General, Itanagar, as part of Audit Week 2025. Scientists from the Birbal Sahni Institution of Palaeosciences, an autonomous institute of the Department of Science and Technology, accidentally found a 37 thousand-year-old bamboo stem bearing traces of long-lost thorn scars during a field survey in the silt-rich deposits of the Chirang River in Manipur's Imphal Valley. The fossil shows that while the harsh conditions of the Ice Age halted bamboo's global spread, northeastern India provided a safe haven where the plant continued to flourish. This Asia's oldest thorned bamboo fossil could rewrite a new chapter in the continent's botanical history.
