Four persons who were involved in the alleged death of an individual at a rehabilitation centre, Yeshu Arms Wellness Foundation, located at Chekiye Village, Chümoukedima have been arrested by the police. Police said four individuals along with the owner of the rehabilitation centre have been arrested and are now in police custody. Taking cognizance of the case Dimapur Police registered a suo motto FIR at Diphuhar Police station and initiated a detailed investigation. All necessary procedural steps are being taken to ensure that those responsible are brought to justice without delay. Police said a parallel inquiry into the rehabilitation centre to verify its compliance with licensing and operational standards has been initiated.
