The GST Bachat Utsav began on 22nd of September as the Narendra Modi government reduced GST rates across several sectors, benefiting citizens nationwide. Today, our correspondent brings a report on how the next-generation GST reforms in the Apparel and footwear sector are helping citizens.

The next-generation GST reforms have provided major relief to the apparel and footwear sector. Under the new tax structure, GST has been reduced from 12 percent to 5 percent on chamois leather, composition leather made from leather fibre, and leather prepared after tanning or crusting. Similarly, footwear priced up to 2 thousand and five hundred rupees per pair now attract only 5 percent GST instead of the previous 12 percent. Meanwhile, the GST has been reduced to 2 percent for Readymade Garments upto 2,500 rupees per piece. This rationalisation has significantly encouraged the country's manufacturing base, benefiting consumers and making these products more affordable.
