The Office of the Director General of Police (DGP), Kohima, has announced revisions in the ongoing constable (GD) recruitment particularly for Dimapur, Chumoukedima, and Niuland districts. Earlier, Dimapur, Chumoukedima, Niuland were allotted 144 posts under the "open competition" category for all indigenous tribes of Nagaland. However upon government's review, these posts in the three districts will now be allocated among the indigenous Naga tribes based on tribal ratios from the 2011 census of the erstwhile Dimapur district. The detailed allocation for each tribe, along with male-female breakdowns, will be available on the Nagaland Police Recruitment Portal and the Department's website https://police.nagaland.gov.in.

Candidates from the three districts who have already applied can modify their district choice on the portal from 8th November after which a revised admit card will be issued. Further, the online application deadline has also been extended by 15 days, and will closed on 22nd November. All other recruitment guidelines issued in the advertisement issued on 30th September remain unchanged. Meanwhile, out of the 32,105 candidates registered for the recruitment, 29,825 have already paid their examination fee. The Nagaland Police has urged all registered candidates who intend to appear for the recruitment to ensure their examination fee is paid before the deadline.
