Prime Minister Narendra Modi flagged off four new Vande Bharat Express trains from Banaras Railway Station today. Speaking on the occasion, Prime Minister Modi said that trains like Vande Bharat, Namo Bharat, and Amrit Bharat are laying the foundation for the next generation of Indian Railways. He said that today with the launch of four new Vande Bharat trains - Banaras-Khajuraho, Lucknow-Saharanpur, Firozpur-Delhi and Ernakulam-Bengaluru - the number of Vande Bharat trains running in the country has increased to more than 160. The Prime Minister said that infrastructure in developed countries across the world has played an important role in their economic upliftment. Following the construction of Baba Vishwanath Dham and the Ram Temple in Ayodhya, new doors of prosperity are opening in Uttar Pradesh due to the increasing number of devotees visiting the temple.
