NEWS IN ORDER:-

DONER

In a significant step towards enhancing tourism infrastructure in Meghalaya, Union Minister for Development of North Eastern Region (DoNER), Jyotiraditya M. Scindia will lay the foundation stone for the Integrated Development of Sohra Tourism Circuit Project in Sohra today. The project, worth more than Rs 200 crore funded under the PM-DevINE scheme, aims to strengthen tourism infrastructure, sustainable livelihood opportunities and preserve Sohra's unique cultural and natural heritage. The project will enhance visitor facilities, promote eco-friendly tourism and create employment avenues for local communities, ensuring inclusive and sustainable benefits of tourism growth. Tomorrow, the Minister will visit Mawmluh Cave, known globally for its geo-tourism significance. Later in the day, the Minister will visit Guwahati, Assam, where he is scheduled to inaugurate several key DoNER projects and visit IIT Guwahati.

RENEWABLE

Union Minister for New and Renewable Energy, Pralhad Venkatesh Joshi on Friday said that the new and renewable energy sector is growing rapidly in India and it is the second largest growth market for renewable energy in the world. Speaking with media persons during the inaugural session of the Regional Workshop on Renewable Energy: North East Zone in Guwahati,

Joshi said that Assam is the best performing state under the PM Surya Ghar in Northeastern States.

CHERRY

The Meghalaya government is expecting the upcoming Shillong Cherry Blossom Festival 2025 to attract more than 50,000 overnight tourists this year, Chief Minister Conrad K Sangma said on Friday. The festival, he added, will also see overall footfall in lakhs, including day visitors. Unveiling the lineup, Sangma said the Cherry Blossom Festival 2025 will be a grand celebration of music, art and culture showcasing the rich diversity of Meghalaya with global and local performers set to take the stage. Day one will feature The Script, Jason Derulo, and Nora Fatehi, while day two will see performances by Aqua and rap-pop sensation Tyga. The festival will close with a show by world-renowned DJ and producer Diplo. The chief minister also announced a "special tribute to the legendary artist Zubeen Garg" to be performed by musicians close to him. The event will feature activities such as the traditional Mr. and Miss Cherry Blossom competition, cosplay, cherry blossom arm wrestling, and other cultural events.

DAY

Governor of Arunachal Pradesh, Lt. General K. T. Parnaik (Retd.) led the Rashtriya Ekta Diwas (National Unity Day) celebration at Raj Bhavan, Itanagar on Friday. The day marks the birth anniversary of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, the Iron Man of India, whose vision and leadership were instrumental in uniting the nation. In his address, the Governor remembered Bharat Ratna Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel and said that his life is a timeless reminder that perseverance, integrity, and dedication can bring about transformative change. MANIPUR
