Veer Baal Diwas is observed to honour the bravery and sacrifice of the Sahibzades – Baba Zorawar Singh Ji and Baba Fateh Singh Ji – the young sons of Sri Guru Gobind Singh Ji.

CHRISTMAS

Christmas was celebrated amid religious solemnity and joy in a peaceful atmosphere across the Northeastern region along with the rest of the country and the world yesterday. Midnight services in churches and carol processions through illuminated streets were taken out. Church leaders called upon people to reflect on the message of hope, peace and love associated with the birth of Jesus Christ. People gathered at churches for prayers and hymns to mark the festival. Governors and chief ministers greeted the people on Christmas.

SHILLONG

The dazzling Christmas illumination in Shillong has been drawing people from far and near. Large numbers of tourists descended on the hill city to revel in the festivities. The faithful attended early morning services in several churches and chapels and greeted each other across Meghalaya.

CAROL

The Jingiaseng Samla Balang Presbyterian Kynshi Them, as part of its annual tradition, organised a Christmas Carol procession as part of the Christmas celebrations. The carol procession commenced from the Presbyterian Church Kynshi Them, and proceeded along the NH-44E national highway passing through Kynshi Bangla Village before concluding at the church premises. The event witnessed the participation of thousands of people, including children, youth, elders and women, who took part wearing various colourful costumes, including traditional attires.

PMGSY

One of India's most impactful rural infrastructure initiatives, the Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY), marked its 25th anniversary yesterday. The scheme was launched on 25th December, 2000 to ensure all-weather connectivity to previously unconnected rural habitations. The programme has emerged as a key enabler of agricultural growth, employment generation, improved access to education, health services, and poverty alleviation. Since its inception, over 8 lakh 25 thousand kilometres of rural roads have been sanctioned under PM Gram Sadak Yojana, with more than 7 lakh 87 thousand kilometres completed. Budgetary allocations to the Scheme in recent years reflect the government's sustained emphasis on strengthening rural road connectivity. Around 19 thousand crore rupees have been allocated for the financial year 2025-26.

BRIDGE

The much-awaited four-lane bridge connecting Garo Hills in Meghalaya with Assam, which is expected to be a game-changer for the region, is 65 per cent complete. The project is set to take another three years to be fully completed. In its project updates, the National Highways & Infrastructure Development Corporation Limited stated that the 19.28-kilometer four-lane bridge includes approaches over the River Brahmaputra between Dhubri (on the North Bank, Assam) and Phulbari (on the South Bank, Meghalaya) on National Highway-127B.

CIVIC

Under the its Civic Action Programme, the Khonsa Battalion of the Assam Rifles has arranged for a National Integration Tour for students from Wangcha Rajkumar Government College, Deomali, Tirap District, Arunachal Pradesh. The students will attend the 26th Rashtra Katha Shivir, organised by Shri Vedic Mission Trust at Village Pransla, District Rajkot, Gujarat. A total of 11 students is participating in the tour, scheduled from 27th December to 4th January. The tour was flagged off yesterday by Wangki Lowang, Minister of Geology, Mining and Minerals, Government of Arunachal Pradesh from Deomali. The initiative aims to inculcate a sense of nationalism, foster national integration and expose the North Eastern youth to India's rich cultural heritage and developmental progress.

WEATHER

The India Meteorological Department has issued an orange colour warning for dense to very dense fog over Delhi, Assam, Meghalaya, Haryana, Uttarakhand, Chandigarh, Punjab, Bihar, Uttar Pradesh, West Bengal and Sikkim till Sunday. The IMD said that dense fog conditions will also prevail over parts of North East. The IMD, Imphal Center predicts moderate to heavy fog in isolated areas of various districts of Manipur. Senapati, Imphal-East, Imphal-West, Ukhrul, Bishenpur, Thoubal, Kakching, Churachandpur, and Pherjawl, will experience foggy conditions over the next few days. Yellow alert has been issued in this regard. The Senapati district recorded a minimum temperature of 6.65 degree celsius, and was the coldest among all the other districts.
