# **NEWS IN ORDER:-**

#### **TRIPURA-AWARD**

Tripura has achieved a significant milestone by securing the second position nationally in the fifth category of the National Energy Conservation Awards 2025 for its efforts in energy conservation and energy efficiency. The award was presented the President, Droupadi Murmu at Vigyan Bhawan in New Delhi yesterday. The award was received on behalf of the state by Dr. Subir Sen, Technical Director of Tripura State Electricity Corporation Limited, and Sima Das, Nodal Officer of the State Designated Agency for the Bureau of Energy Efficiency. Tripura Power Minister, Ratanlal Nath has extended his congratulations to the state on this remarkable achievement. A total of 11 states and union territories participated in the competition under this specific group.

## **PANCHAYAT POLLS**

In Arunachal Pradesh, the general elections to the panchayati raj institutions and municipal bodies of Itanagar, Papumpare, Pasighat, and East Siang district will be held today in a single phase from 7 am till 4 pm. Out of 8,208 seats of Gram Panchayats, 6,227 candidates have been elected unopposed. The polling will be held only for 1,947 seats. There are 2,171 polling stations for the panchayat and municipal elections, while 79 polling stations have been established for the elections of the Itanagar Municipal Corporation and Pasighat Municipal Council. Approximately 15,000 polling personnel have been deployed to ensure the elections are conducted smoothly.

## **ARTICLE-MODI**

Prime Minister Narendra Modi yesterday shared an article written by Union Minister for Development of North-Eastern Region, Jyotiraditya Scindia in an English daily on Nagaland's Hornbill Festival. Responding to Scindia's post on social media, the Prime Minister said, the Minister's article described

Nagaland's Hornbill Festival as a kaleidoscope of the human spirit and a masterful convergence of the ancient and the contemporary. He reiterated that the country will rise only when the North East shines. Scindia highlighted that the Prime Minister's vision has placed the North East at the forefront of India's development journey, unlocking its economic and human potential. Sharing his article on social media, he added that the Hornbill Festival of Nagaland gives this transformation a cultural voice, showing that growth is strongest when anchored in identity.

## **GREEN**

Meghalaya has launched a Green Deposit Scheme to curb plastic pollution in high-footfall eco-tourism destinations, reinforcing the state's push for sustainable tourism and stronger waste management. The initiative has been introduced in Sohra, Dawki and the Living Root Bridges areas that have seen a sharp rise in tourism and plastic litter affecting forests, rivers and fragile ecosystems. Under the initiative, tourists carrying plastic items such as bottles or wrappers into notified zones must pay a refundable deposit of 100 rupees, which is returned upon responsible disposal or return of plastic waste at designated exit points. The move is aimed at discouraging littering and promoting a "leave no trace" culture among the visitors. The Green Deposit Scheme is part of Meghalaya's broader waste management reforms, which include community-led sanitation models, improved waste segregation, and stricter enforcement of plastic regulations.

#### **SEMINAR**

In Manipur, Governor Ajay Kumar Bhalla inaugurated a National Seminar on renowned theatre maestro, Ratan Thiyam at the auditorium of Jawaharlal Nehru Manipur Dance Academy in Imphal yesterday. The Governor along with the First Lady led the gathering in paying floral tribute to the portrait of the late cultural icon. He also felicitated the wife and other family members of Ratan Thiyam. On the occasion, a half yearly journal titled 'Manipur Culture and Literature' dedicated to Ratan Thiyam was released. A non-feature film title 'Ratan Thiyam, The Man of Theatre' was also screened. The Governor highlighted Ratan Thiyam's outstanding contribution to Indian and Manipuri theatre. He said that a career spanning more than five decades, Ratan Thiyam

placed Manipur prominently on the global cultural map and remains an ambassador of the State's rich heritage. AIR

The Press Information Bureau fact check has termed a video as fake, being shared on several social media accounts, with the claim that China has started a massive military build-up near Arunachal Pradesh. PIB said that the video showed a military exercise conducted by a brigade of the PLA's 78th Group Army, which is part of the Northern Theatre Command, headquartered in Harbin, Heilongjiang Province, adding this video has no relation to any exercise along the Indian border.

#### **NHM**

Tripura Minister for Social Welfare and Social Education, Tinku Roy, stated that National Health Mission employees played a vital role in providing healthcare services across the state. He made this statement while inaugurating the First State Conference of the National Health Mission Workers' Association, Tripura Pradesh, at Nazrul Kalakshetra in Agartala yesterday. He assured the organization of the government's cooperation in securing the just rights and welfare of these employees. #### NCC

A 10-day, Combined Annual Training Camp is underway for NCC cadets at the Himalayan University campus, Itanagar in Arunachal Pradesh by the Arunachal Pradesh Battalion National Cadet Corps under the aegis of NCC Group Headquarter Tezpur. The aim of the camp is to instill the spirit of camaraderie and nationalism among NCC cadets. A total of 272 volunteer NCC cadets from various institutes of Arunachal Pradesh are participating in the camp. Three associate NCC officers, 12 Army instructors and nine civil staff are actively involved in imparting the training, which will conclude on the 22nd of this month.
