Parliament has passed the Repealing and Amending Bill, 2025, with the Rajya Sabha approving it today after discussion. The Lok Sabha had passed this legislation yesterday. The Bill provides for the repeal of certain enactments and amending certain other enactments. It repeals 71 Acts, including the Indian Tramways Act, 1886, the Levy Sugar Price Equalisation Fund Act, 1976, and the Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited (Determination of Conditions of Service of Employees) Act, 1988.

Centre has said that no breach of data of Aadhaar card holders occurred from the Unique Identification Authority of India database till date. Minister of State for Electronics and Information Technology Jitin Prasada informed this in a written reply to a question in Lok Sabha today.
