The Chümoukedima District Village Councils' Association (CDVCA) has demanded the Chairman of the Ceasefire Monitoring Group (CFMG) in Nagaland to relinquish office, stating that its mechanism is ineffective. In a Press release, the Association opined that the existing CFMG has been an absolute disappointment to the general public. It said, the Chairman of the Ceasefire Monitoring Group/Cell should relinquish office immediately and enable someone, if any, to take up the concerns of the villagers of Nagaland. The Association urged all Naga political groups, which are in ceasefire agreements with the Government of India, to calibrate with the State Government, which obviously has the mandate of the people and conduct themselves in accordance with the laws of the land. The CDVCA called for the restoration of faith and confidence of the people of Nagaland to the institution of Statehood and Union/Federal structure of the Nation. It also opined that illegal activities, be it of factions in Ceasefire agreements or not, be brought under the ambit of the laws of the land, and penalized if and when applicable. The Association further strongly condemned December 15 incident where armed cadres of an NSCN

faction entered a private residence in Aoyimkum village and terrorizing innocent citizens by firing sophisticated weapons in the presence of civilians, traumatizing the entire neighbourhood including senior citizens, and abducting several bonafide citizen of the villagers.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi today inaugurated the new terminal building of the Lokapriya Gopinath Bardoloi International Airport in Guwahati, Assam. He also unveiled an 80-foot statue of Assam's first Chief Minister, Gopinath Bardoloi, outside the new terminal of the airport named after him. Addressing a public gathering in Guwahati, the Prime minister said once again a new chapter is being added to the development of Assam. He said it is a celebration of the development of the entire North East, not just Assam.

The Prime Minister arrived in Guwahati this afternoon on a two-day visit to Assam. During his visit, he will inaugurate and unveil several projects worth around 15,600 crore rupees and address public meetings. Earlier in the day, Prime Minister Modi inaugurated the 66.7 km-long four-laning of the Barajaguli-Krishnanagar section of National Highway-34 in the Nadia district of West Bengal. He also laid the foundation stone for the four-laning of the 17.6 km-long Barasat-Barajaguli section of National Highway-34 in North 24 Parganas district of the state.

Vice President C.P. Radhakrishnan today said that the apparel and textile industry have been vital pillars of country's economic growth. The Vice President said this while addressing the Apparel Export Promotion Council (AEPC) Awards in New Delhi. Mr. Radhakrishnan highlighted that India is the sixth largest exporter of textile globally which stands as a testament to the immense contribution of the textile industry in nation's growth story.

Congratulating the awardees, the Vice President commended their dedication, hardwork and relentless pursuit of excellence which earned them the recognition. He also highlighted that the textile industry is the second-largest job opportunity provider in the country after agriculture. The Vice President also

urged the industry to adopt eco-friendly manufacturing practices, responsible sourcing and strategies to minimize waste.

And, Nagaland made its maiden entry to the final round of the Santosh Trophy in 79 years after drawing 1-1 with the home team Tripura in a Group D match at Umakanta Mini Stadium in Agartala, Tripura yesterday. The result also qualifies Nagaland to play in the National Games, which are scheduled to be held in 2027 in Meghalaya. Tripura took an early lead through Dewashish Rai in the 17th minute from a free kick, before Nagaland's Laiwang Bohham equalized in the 53rd minute. The Santosh Trophy 2025–26 final round will feature 12 teams, including host Assam, last season's champion West Bengal and runner-up Kerala, in Dhakuakhana and Dhemaji.
