Nagaland Board of School Education (NBSE) has filed an FIR with the Police following reports circulating on social media regarding the alleged leakage of question papers of the ongoing phase-II Class IX final exam 2025 from a school in Dimapur. In a statement, the NBSE has appealed to the public not to circulate unverified information online regarding the incident. It clarified that examinations for the remaining subjects will continue as scheduled. However, it directed all registered schools to withhold the results of four subjects — English, Social Science, Science, and Alternative English — pending further review. According to the Board, a re-test may be conducted in all or certain districts depending on the extent of the leakage. The Board added that action will be taken based on the findings of the investigating agency.
