On the occasion, Prime Minister along with DG WHO Dr. Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus inaugurated the new WHO-South East Asia Regional Office complex in Delhi, which will also house the WHO India Country Office, marking a significant milestone in India's partnership with the World Health Organization. The Prime Minister also released the WHO technical report on training in Yoga and the Book From Roots to Global Reach: 11 Years of Transformation in Ayush.

Deputy Commissioner Kohima, B. Henok Buchem, has emphasized the importance of good governance rooted in accountability, transparency, and efficient public service delivery. He was speaking at the Kohima District Workshop on Good Governance Initiatives and Practices, themed "Prashasan Gaon Ki Ore," held yesterday in Kohima. Addressing officers and staff of the Deputy Commissioner's Office, Mr. Buchem said good governance has become a growing priority both nationally and globally, and stressed that Nagaland must strengthen its governance mechanisms to move forward. He noted that Kohima district, particularly the DC Office, is well positioned to set an example. The Deputy Commissioner highlighted the need for systematic and disciplined office functioning, with special focus on proper file management and record-keeping.

He underlined the importance of correct file covers, accurate indexing, structured notesheets, and timely processing of files to enhance transparency and efficiency. Mr. Buchem also spoke on the introduction of a hybrid governance model combining digital and offline processes, and called upon all officials to work collectively towards improving governance standards in the district.

Following the reports of outbreak of African Swine Fever in several districts of Assam, Niuland district administration has temporarily banned import of pigs and piglets as well as transport of live pigs and pork meat to Niuland district from outside the district with immediate effect. The ban will remain in force till the spread of disease is curbed or till it is safe to resume the import of pigs. Any violation of this order will be punishable under relevant provisions of law.
