**The Centre has issued directions to the States for a complete ban on the grant of any new mining leases in the Aravallis in a major step towards conservation and protection of the entire Aravalli Range stretching from Delhi to Gujarat from illegal mining. Environment, Forest and Climate Change Ministry said in a statement that this prohibition applies uniformly across the entire Aravalli landscape and is intended to preserve the integrity of the range. The directions are aimed at safeguarding the Aravallis as a continuous geological ridge extending from Gujarat to the National Capital Region, and at stopping all unregulated mining activities. **News, Union Minister for Environment, Forest and Climate Change Bhupender Yadav said, the Modi government is fully committed to the conservation of the Aravalli range.**

**In cricket, Nagaland went down to Manipur in the final of the Under-19 Cooch Behar Trophy Plate tournament, played at the Sovima Cricket Ground in Chumoukedima. Manipur responded with 170 in their first innings and later reached 77 for three wickets in the second to seal the victory. **In weather... The Northeast region is expected to experience continued dense fog till the end of the year. India Meteorological Department said, dense fog conditions is very likely during night and morning hours in isolated parts of Nagaland and its neighbouring states until 30th of December. Today, Kohima recorded a minimum of 7 degrees Celsius and a maximum of 17 degrees Celsius, with mainly clear skies.**
