President Droupadi Murmu has said, Viksit Bharat will be achieved not just by building strong economy but also by ensuring equal opportunities and life of dignity to poor people. The President was addressing the 15th convocation ceremony of National Institute of Technology (NIT) at Jamshedpur in Jharkhand yesterday. The President said government initiatives across traditional and emerging sectors are creating entrepreneurial opportunities for skilled youth to generate employment for themselves and others. Earlier in the day, the President attended the Centenary celebrations of Ol Chiki script of Santhali Language in Jamshedpur.



Minority Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju has emphasized for creating a Delhi-like special unit of Police For North-Eastern Region in other states to ensure protection of North-eastern people. Agriculture, Farmers' Welfare and Rural Development Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan yesterday said, the Central Government has introduced a new law, Viksit Bharat-G Ram G, to address shortcomings and irregularities in the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA), 2005. The Minister was speaking at the State-Level Kisan Diwas-2025 programme at Gauchar in

Uttarakhand. He said, the guaranteed employment has been increased from 100 days to 125 days under the new law.



Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) yesterday successfully conducted the maiden flight test of the Pinaka Long Range Guided Rocket at the Integrated Test Range, Chandipur. Defence Minister Rajnath Singh congratulated DRDO on the achievement. He said that the successful design and development of long-range guided rockets will boost the capabilities of the Armed Forces, terming it a game changer.
