NEWS IN ORDER:-

PM-ASSAM:

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will perform Bhumi Pujan of the 12,000 crore rupees Ammonia-Urea fertiliser project at Namrup in Assam today. He will also address a public meeting at Namrup. On his second day visit, the Prime Minister will also interact with 25 school students in his programme, Pariksha Pe Charcha while sailing on the Brahmaputra river aboard a cruise ship. Later he will visit the newly constructed Swahid Smarak Kshetra, at Pachim Boragaon, Guwahati, built in memory of 860 martyrs of the Assam Movement. Yesterday, the Prime Minister inaugurated the state-of-the-art new Terminal Building of the Lokapriya Gopinath Bardoloi International Airport and unveiled the statue of former Assam Chief Minister, Gopinath Bardoloi. Spread over nearly 1.4 lakh square metres, the new Terminal Building was designed to handle up to 1.3 crore passengers annually. Addressing a public meeting outside the new Terminal building, Modi said that the Union Government is committed for the development of Assam. He said that during the last 11 years, several mega historic infrastructure projects initiated and completed in the state.

VISIT:

A delegation from the Kagawa Prefectural Assembly, Japan is on an official visit to Manipur with an objective of strengthening bilateral cooperation particularly in areas of human resource development and sectoral collaboration. The delegation held a meeting with Manipur Chief Secretary, Dr. Puneet Kumar Goel along with the Secretary of Skills, Labour, Employment and Entrepreneurship. A meeting with

senior officials of the Manipur government chaired by Additional Chief Secretary was also held where the Japanese delegation outlined the current status of foreign human resource acceptance in Kagawa Prefecture and expressed keen interest to cooperate with Manipur in meeting the workforce requirements in key sectors such as agriculture, forestry, construction, manufacturing, wholesale and retail trade, accommodation and food services and social welfare with particular emphasis on nursing care.

CIVIC BODY:

The People's Party of Arunachal has wrested the Pasighat Municipal Council from the BJP, winning five out of eight wards to secure a clear majority. BJP won two seats, while one seat went to an Independent. The result is seen as a setback for the BJP in East Siang district and a morale boost for the PPA. In contrast, the BJP retained power in the Itanagar Municipal Corporation, securing 14 out of 20 wards, including four uncontested seats. New entrant Lok Janshakti Party (Ram Vilas) won two seats, NCP three and one seat went to an Independent. The Congress failed to open its account in both the civic bodies.

SCIENCE CONGRESS:

The Manipur Science Congress 2025 was held at Manipur University under the theme 'Science, Innovation and Climate Change'. The inaugural function was graced by Manipur Governor, Ajay Kumar Bhalla in the presence of Vice Chancellor of Manipur University, Prof. N. Lokendra Singh, and other dignitaries. Addressing the function, the Governor said, Manipur with its exceptional biodiversity and unique ecological conditions, serves as a living laboratory for scientific research, particularly in areas such as climate change, biotechnology, sustainable agriculture and environmental studies. The Governor stated that platforms such as the Manipur Science Congress plays a crucial role in fostering collaboration, encouraging quality research and enabling wider dissemination of findings through national and international publications.

LAND PATTAS:

Tripura Minister for Social Welfare and Social Education, Tinku Roy informed that around 4,000 tea garden worker families in the state have so far been provided with land pattas, while nearly 5,000 families have received ration cards. The minister made the statement while inaugurating a newly constructed agricultural produce godown, an open market shed and a community hall at Halaichhara Bazar in Chandipur Block. As part of the programme, land pattas were distributed to 29 tea garden worker families. Addressing the gathering, the minister said that providing land rights to tea garden workers has been given the highest importance. A booklet highlighting the developmental works carried out by the Kailashahar Municipal Council over the past four years was also released. Several organisations, institutions and individuals were felicitated for setting exemplary benchmarks in social service.

EXPLOSION:

In Manipur, three minor children were injured when a 51 mm mortar shell exploded at Molnoi village in Tengnoupal district. According to police, the incident occurred in the afternoon at around 1.10 PM when the children were playing near the blast site. One among the three kids is in critical condition, and a nearby Assam Rifles post gave them treatment. A case has been filed and investigation is on.

ELEPHANTS:

In Assam, seven elephants were killed, and one was injured yesterday early morning after a herd of jumbos was hit by the Sairang-New Delhi Rajdhani Express in Hojai district. Officials said, five coaches and the train's engine were

also derailed. No passengers were injured in the accident. The accident in Changjurai village was suspected to have occurred due to heavy fog in the area.

PROTEST:

In protest against the recent demonstrations in front of the Indian High Commission in Dhaka, Bangladesh and attacks on minority there, the Sanatani Hindu Sena Samaj staged a protest in front of the Bangladesh Assistant High Commission office in Agartala yesterday. Representatives of the Samaj submitted a memorandum to the Bangladesh Assistant High Commission in Agartala and at the same time, they appealed for the maintenance of cordial and friendly relations between the two neighbouring countries.

CONVOCATION:

Arunachal Pradesh Governor, K T Parnaik yesterday graced the 8th convocation of Himalayan University at its Jollang campus as chief guest and conferred gold, silver and bronze medals on meritorious students. A total of 621 graduates, including PhD scholars, were awarded degrees. Congratulating the students, the Governor described them as the pride of the state and the nation, and urged them to serve the society with integrity, compassion and a spirit of lifelong learning. Highlighting the vision of Viksit Bharat @ 2047, he stressed on ethical and responsible innovation in emerging fields such as artificial intelligence, renewable energy and biotechnology.

HOSPITAL:

Tripura Minister for Youth Affairs and Sports, Tinku Roy, yesterday said that the state government is taking strong steps to bring drug addicts back to normal life through proper medical treatment. He informed that the government is setting up one hospital in all eight districts for the treatment and rehabilitation. Addressing the inaugural programme of a workshop on “Drug-Free Tripura” at Unakoti Kalakshetra in Kailashahar, the minister said, construction of a 50-bedded hospital is currently underway in Kailashahar and expressed confidence that it will be made operational within the next one year, which will significantly strengthen the de-addiction and rehabilitation facilities in the region.

SANTOSH:

Sikkim will face Arunachal in Group E of the Senior Men’s National Football Championship Santosh Trophy at the SSA Stadium in Shillong today evening. A win will put Sikkim through to the final round but even a draw will knock the hosts, Meghalaya out of contention. Sikkim came from a goal down in the first half to win 2-1 against Meghalaya in the first Group E match on the 19th of this month.
