Prime Minister Narendra Modi during his address to the nation in his Mann Ki Baat programme on Akashvani today, exuded pride that the India AI Impact Summit has proved to be a turning point in the trajectory of how the world will utilize the power of AI in the future. During this period, India also launched three Made in India AI Models. He hailed the Summit for being the biggest AI summit ever. PM Modi spoke about a little girl from Kerala, Aalin Sherin Abraham, who lost her life at the age of just ten months. He lauded Aalin's father, Arun Abraham and mother, Sherin for their decision to donate Aalin's organs. He also cited the example of Lakshmi Devi from Delhi who traveled to Kedarnath last year. She trekked 14 kilometers after a heart transplant. Speaking about Digital Arrest, PM Modi urged everyone to remain vigilant and not fall prey to such fraudsters. He stated on the occasion of Rajaji Utsav tomorrow, a statue of C. Rajagopalachari, the first Indian Governor General of Independent India will replace the statue of British architect Edwin Lutyens in the Central Courtyard of Rashtrapati Bhavan.

The first Official Border pillar between Arunachal Pradesh and Assam has been successfully constructed at Seijosa in Pakke Kessang District, today. The construction of the first pillar was closely monitored by a joint contingent of senior officials from both states to ensure accuracy and mutual agreement. Chief Minister Pema Khandu said the Seijosa pillar sets the blueprint for the remaining demarcation process, strengthening cooperation between the two states and paving the way for lasting harmony, development and confidence among the people residing in the border regions. Calling the event historic, Arunachal Minister for Health & Family Welfare Biyuram Wahge who was present on the location, said it signifies a concrete step towards resolving the long-standing boundary dispute between the two states, keeping with the spirit of the Namsai Declaration.

The Inter-State Youth Exchange Programme was inaugurated at Don Bosco Youth Centre Itanagar in Arunachal. 37 Youth participants from different districts of West Bengal, including Kolkata, Howrah, Bankura, Murshidabad, Barasat, Malda and North 24 Parganas, expressed their excitement and gratitude. The programme will continue till 26th February

2026 with cultural performances, interactive sessions, and exposure visits aimed at strengthening bonds of friendship and national integration.

Basar MLA Nyabi Jini Dirchi today inaugurated the 'Higur Iisi' Packaged Drinking Water Manufacturing Plant at Tahum Litak, Himi Pobdi, Leparada district. She said it's a giant leap towards self-reliance for the district. She urged to support local entrepreneurs and products like Higur Iisi to build a stronger future. She also urged other entrepreneurs in the district to follow suit and establish more such ventures, creating earning opportunities for all. On Saturday, the MLA also laid the foundation stone for the CC Bridge spanning the Kidi River and the link road connecting Poru Rimi, under Dari Circle to Pagi Village, via Disi under Basar Circle.

The Spearhead Division, Spear Corps under Operation Sadbhavana inaugurated new pucca toilet blocks for boys and girls at government primary school in Mongku village, East Siang District. This reaffirms its commitment to military-civil bond and people-centric development. The facility was inaugurated by Group Captain (rtd) Mohonto Panging Pao, in the presence of officers from Sigar Military Station, civil administration representatives, village elders, school authorities and students.

Tezu MLA cum Advisor to Health Minister Dr. Mohesh Chai held a discussion with Executive Engineer and Assistant Engineer PHED, Tezu regarding the shortage of drinking water in Tezu township, especially in Tribal colony. They briefed the MLA that the water source of WTP, Shivajinagar dries up every winter which is causing the problem. Dr. Chai said work towards an alternate source of water tapping for WTP Shivajinagar is in process. Meanwhile, the MLA instructed them to cater to the water needs of the public through every possible means like water tanker. He also asked them to do a detailed water mapping of Tezu township area for proper future planning.

In the ICC Men's T20 World Cup, Super 8 stage, in the first match on Sunday at Pallekele, Sri Lanka lost to England by 51 runs. The co-hosts were dismissed for 95 runs in 16.4 overs, chasing a target of 147. In the second match at the Narendra Modi Stadium in Ahmedabad, winning the toss South Africa opted to bat first against India and were 52/3 in 7 overs.
