Prime Minister Narendra Modi today welcomed the world leaders, captains of industry, innovators, policymakers, researchers, and technology enthusiasts from across the globe to the AI Impact Summit at Bharat Mandapam, New Delhi. The Summit, themed "Sarvajana Hitaya, Sarvajana Sukhaya — Welfare for All, Happiness for All", reflects India's commitment to harnessing Artificial Intelligence for human-centric progress and inclusive development. Meanwhile PM also underscored India's leadership in the global AI transformation, powered by the strength of its 1.4 billion people, robust digital public infrastructure, vibrant startup ecosystem, and cutting-edge research. He emphasized that India's strides in AI reflect both ambition and responsibility, positioning the nation at the forefront of technological advancement.

Governor of Arunachal Pradesh, Lt. General K.T. Parnaik, extended his warm greetings to the people of Arunachal Pradesh in general, and to Wancho brethren in particular on the joyous occasion of Oriah Festival, He wished that the vibrant festival strengthen emotional bonds, reinforce the spirit of brotherhood, and usher in peace, prosperity, and harmony in our society.
