The directions were issued last evening based on the Union Government's request as 31st March, the last day of financial year 2025-26 is a public holiday on account of Mahavir Jayanti.



The District Administration Zunheboto has temporary closed a portion of NH-702A from Zhekiye village to Sukhai village due to ongoing road construction works between Zhekiye and Tizu Bridge. According to a travel advisory, the stretch will remain closed to all forms of vehicular movement with immediate effect till 15th of March 2026 to ensure smooth and uninterrupted execution of the construction work. Travellers have been advised to take the alternate Satakha–Xuivi–Sukhai route and vice versa during the period.
