A multidisciplinary research team has been awarded Second Prize at the AI-Powered Education Global Award 2025–2026 Contest, organised by the ASEM Lifelong Learning Hub, Chulalongkorn University, Thailand. The team was awarded for their innovative project titled “Preserving Heritage through Technology: A Scalable NLP Solution for Nagamese Language (NagaLanguge.ai)”.

The award-winning project addresses a critical gap in artificial intelligence by enhancing machine translation for low-resource and underrepresented languages, with a special focus on Nagamese, a widely spoken creole of Northeast India. The study was led by Dr R Vasanthan, Associate Professor, and co-authored by researchers from Nagaland University, SRM Institute of Science and Technology, National College (Autonomous) Tiruchirappalli, Central University of Haryana, and Central University of Tamil Nadu.
