Prime Minister Narendra Modi will interact with students across the country in the second episode of the Pariksha Pe Charcha 2026 this morning. The programme is scheduled to be telecast at 10 am across multiple platforms. With board exams around the corner, the interaction will focus on addressing exam stress, preparation strategies, time management and helping students approach tests with confidence. The Prime Minister in a social media post said that this episode will feature exam warriors from Coimbatore in Tamil Nadu, Raipur in Chhattisgarh, Dev Mogra in Gujarat and Guwahati in Assam. Minister for Public Works Department (Roads and Bridges), G Kaito Aye, on Saturday inspected ongoing construction under the Foothills Road project in the Niuland and Baghty sections. Accompanied by senior PWD officials, the Minister reviewed an upgraded 8.6-kilometre stretch in Niuland, including a proposed 120-foot modular steel bridge and connectivity road to Rengmapani village, expressing satisfaction with the quality of work. At Baghty, he assessed three road stretches covering 38.6 kilometres and multiple modular bridge projects, noting that bridge components are expected to be erected within February. Emphasizing timely completion, the Minister directed contractors to speed up work and warned against unnecessary delays. Contractors have assured completion of all works by March 31, 2026. The Minister also instructed technical staff of the Baghty Division, PWD (R&B), to extend necessary cooperation to contractors while strictly ensuring adherence to quality standards. Reiterating the Government's commitment to people-centric infrastructure, Mr. Aye described the Foothills Road as a transformative corridor that will enhance connectivity, stimulate economic growth, and bridge regional disparities in Nagaland.

The Narcotic Cell of Police Headquarters Kohima has seized a significant quantity of illegally smuggled foreign cigarettes and suspected heroin during a special surprise Motor Vehicle Check Post drive conducted on the night of February 7. According to an official statement issued by the Superintendent of Police (Narcotics), the operation was carried out as part of routine enforcement and anti-smuggling measures. During the drive, personnel from the Narcotic Cell detected and seized approximately 10 soap cases of suspected heroin. In the same operation, the team also intercepted and confiscated a large consignment of illegally smuggled foreign cigarettes, estimated to be worth around 75 lakh rupees. The cigarettes were found to have been transported without valid customs documentation and are suspected to be of foreign origin. Authorities believe the seized goods were intended for illegal distribution, causing potential revenue loss to the government and violating Customs laws. The

police further informed that the confiscated cigarettes have been handed over to the Customs Department for further investigation and legal proceedings under the relevant provisions of the Customs Act and other applicable laws. Further investigations are underway

The Joint Action Committee (JAC) of COVID-era appointed healthcare workers stated that the issue of their regularisation is no longer an executive matter, but a legally and constitutionally settled one. In a statement, the JAC said the Cabinet's February 3, 2026 decision to keep the regularisation order on hold is unlawful and violates constitutional provisions. The committee asserted that the appointments have already attained legal effect and warned that continued delay or obstruction could amount to contempt of court. It urged the State Government and the Naga Students' Federation to resolve the matter in accordance with the law. The JAC warned of legal action and democratic protest to safeguard their constitutional rights, professional dignity, and livelihood.
