India and Brazil finalized ten agreements to strengthen cooperation across critical minerals, digital cooperation, sharing of traditional knowledge, health, MSME, entrepreneurship and mass communication, among others in New Delhi today. The decisions were taken following bilateral talks between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Brazil President Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva at Hyderabad House. Both leaders committed to raise bilateral trade to over 20 billion dollars in the next five years. They also called for urgent reform of the United Nations, in particular the UN Security Council.

Union Home Minister Amit Shah today said that the nation has taken a pledge to wipe out Naxalism from the country by 31st of next month. Addressing the CRPF personnel during the 87th Raising Day parade in Guwahati, Mr. Shah said the CRPF

has rendered unparalleled service to the nation. He said, CRPF jawans and the Cobra Battalions are doing unprecedented work in making the country Naxal-free.

He said, 2 thousand 270 brave personnel have laid down their lives in service to the country. He said, 700 personnel of this force sacrificed their lives in the north-east alone. On this occasion, Union Home Minister reviewed the ceremonial parade and took the salute.



Union Minister of State for Consumer Affairs Good & Public Distribution, Nimuben Jayantibhai Bambhaniya has said that special emphasis has been placed on education and the development of the Northeastern states under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership. She said this during her visit to Government Middle School, Kuda village today. She said the government is committed to making the region self-reliant under the vision of Atmanirbhar Bharat and promoting Vocal for Local products. Highlighting the government's guiding principle of Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas, Sabka Vishwas, Sabka Prayas, Mrs Bambhaniya said continuous efforts are being made for the upliftment of the poor, youth, farmers and women. The Union Minister noted that special emphasis has put on the provision of clean drinking water, toilets and basic facilities in primary schools to create a better learning environment adding that schools across the country are being modernised to provide students with access to improved facilities and quality education.



A 40-Hour Mediation training programme being organized by the Nagaland State Legal Services Authority under the aegis of Mediation & Conciliation Project Committee (MCPC), Supreme Court of India began at Kohima today. Principal District & Sessions Judge Kohima & Former Registrar, Supreme Court of India incharge of mediation & legal services Mezivolu T Therieh has underscored that mediation is an ongoing movement in the country and there is need for more and more trainers. She highlighted that it is part of a broader family of alternative

dispute resolution mechanism for reducing case loads and enhancing access to justice while maintaining its focus on pre-litigation.

Member Secretary Neiko Akami, expressed that there was dearth of trained mediators in Nagaland and mediators were penetrated in Dimapur and Kohima during the 1st 90 days nationwide mediation drive last year. To provide access for Mediation to all beneficiaries by training learned counsels coming from all districts of the state, this training has been initiated this year. MCPC Senior Trainers Reema Bhandari and Rita Das Mozumdar are resource persons for the training.



Vice chancellor in-charge Nagaland University Professor B. Kilangla Jamir has described mother language as core identity, cultural anchor and emotional inheritance which shapes individual character and community strength. She was speaking at the Mother Language Day observed held at the University today. Professor Jamir stressed the urgent preservation and active promotion indigenous tongues amid rapid globalization and digital expansion. Highlighting youth responsibility, she called younger generation custodians of heritage, torchbearers linguistic pride, drivers future language growth. Neizo Puro from Department of Botany encouraged participants to save and propagate one's mother language by tracing back to the history and development of language. He also emphasized the importance of respecting linguistic diversity and promoting, understanding among communities and utilizing the digital world to enhance mother language.



Two-day Soybean Festival concluded at Agri Expo, Chümoukedima, under ICAR–AICRP Soybean, School Agricultural Sciences, Nagaland University, Medziphema Campus today. Director, ICAR-NBPGR Dr. GP Singh described soybean as a miracle crop for economic empowerment and nutritional security. He emphasized the need for research support, improved germplasm, and scientific cultivation techniques to expand production. Director Agriculture department, Sanuzo Nienu

said soybean has high-protein, high-oil legume vital for human food, livestock, and poultry feed. Highlighting its health benefits, Mr Neinu said that soybean enriches the soil through nitrogen fixation, reduces dependence on chemical fertilizers, and holds significant industrial potential through value addition.



Advisor for Construction and Allied Works Department and Taxes, Kudecho Khamo, today pointed out the importance of honesty and integrity, asserting that retrospection and introspection are vital for co-existing as an upright community. He was addressing 44th General Session of the Chakhesang Public Organisation in Phek. Mr. Khamo urged the people to stand by resolutions adopted by the CPO including prohibition on pig or pork and the preservation of flora and fauna. Expressing concern over substance abuse and other negative influences, he urged united efforts to combat the growing menace. The legislator also called for optimal utilisation of government-aided funds to support farmers and families, and advocated a mass movement centred on "One Family, One Project; One Family, One Entrepreneur."
