The Election Commission of India yesterday announced that Assembly elections in Assam, Keralam, Puducherry and Tamil Nadu will be held in a single phase, while polling in West Bengal will take place in two phases. Announcing the poll schedule in New Delhi, Chief Election Commissioner Gyanesh Kumar said voting in Assam, Keralam and Puducherry will be held on 9th of April, while in Tamil Nadu polling will take place on 23rd. In West Bengal, voting will be conducted in two phases on 23rd and 29th of April. The first phase in the state will cover 152 Assembly constituencies and the second phase will cover 142 constituencies. Counting of votes for all four states and the Union Territory will be held on the 4th of May. The notification for the Assembly elections in Assam, Keralam and Puducherry will be issued today . The notification for Tamil Nadu and for the first phase of Assembly polls in West Bengal will be issued on 30th of March. Notification for the second phase of polling in West Bengal will be issued on 2nd of April. Mr Kumar said, with the announcement of the poll schedule, the Model Code of Conduct has come into force with immediate effect in the states and the Union Territory.

The Election Commission has announced bye-elections to eight Assembly Constituencies spread across six states. The Assembly Constituencies are Ponda seat in Goa, Umreth in Gujarat, Bagalkot and Davanagere South in Karnataka, Rahuri and Baramati in Maharashtra, Koridang in Nagaland and Dharmanagar seat in Tripura. During a press conference in New Delhi yesterday , Chief Election Commissioner Gyanesh Kumar said, the notification for bypoll in Goa, Karnataka, Nagaland and Tripura will be issued today and polling will be held on 9th of April.

The National Highway Authority of India (NHAI) has announced the revision of the applicable fee for the FASTag Annual Pass from the current 3000 rupees to 3075 rupees for the Financial Year 2026-27. The

Ministry of Road Transport and Highways said, the increased fees of seventy five rupees will be applicable from the first of the next month.

It added that the revised rate will be applicable for eligible non-commercial vehicles with a valid FASTag seeking to avail the Annual Pass facility at over one thousand fee plazas on National Highways and National Expressways.

The Indian men's football team will play its final match of the AFC Asian Cup Saudi Arabia 2027 Qualifiers against Hong Kong in Kochi on the 31st of this month. India is already out of contention for a place in the AFC Asian Cup 2027. However, the team will aim to finish its qualifying campaign with a win. The match will still be important as FIFA ranking points will be at stake. Hong Kong has also been eliminated from the competition. This will be the third different home venue for India in the final round of the qualifiers. Earlier matches were held in Shillong against Bangladesh and in Margao against Singapore.
