Prime Minister Narendra Modi has said that Somnath stands tall and eternal and showcases the country's civilization-nal courage and unbroken devotion. Mr Modi today participated in Somnath Amrut Mahotsav, marking 75 years since the inauguration of the restored Somnath Temple in Gujarat. In a social media post, Mr Modi said that the waving flag at the holy Somnath Temple is a symbol of the victory of the faith of Bharat and also a divine proclamation of the collective consciousness of millions of Indians.

Chief Minister, Pema Khandu today congratulated the Department of Cardiology, TRIHMS for successfully performing Arunachal Pradesh's first Per-cu-taneous Trans-luminal Coronary Angio-plasty (PTCA) with Intravascular Lithotripsy (IVL) on a patient with complex Triple Vessel Coronary Artery Disease and heavy calcium load. Describing the breakthrough as a redefining moment in Arunachal's healthcare services, Khandu in a social media post informed that while routine angio-plasty procedures are regularly conducted at TRIHMS, with more than 1000 successful cases already completed, this was a rare and highly complex procedure, the first of its kind in Arunachal Pradesh. He emphasized that the successful use of Intravascular Litho-tripsy technology marks a major milestone in advanced cardiac care in the state.

The District Administration in collaboration with the Department of Art & Culture under the aegis of the Ministry of Culture, Government of India celebrated Somnath Swa-bhi-man Parv today at the Shree Siddheshwar Nath Shiva Lingam site in Kardo, Ziro. Minister of Cultural Affairs, Dasanglu Pul, Chief Information Commissioner, Jarken Gamlin and others attended the celebrations. A key highlight of the day was the live streaming of the national-level program held at Somnath, Gujarat. Attendees joined citizens across the country in watching the proceedings graced by Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Member of the Arunachal Administrative Reforms Commission, Hento karga today convened a meeting at the DC Office Conference Hall, Yingkiang. The meeting deliberated on administrative reforms and measures for improving governance and public service delivery in the district. While addressing the gathering, Mr. Karga highlighted the objectives of the Commission and stated that despite rapid technological advancements, the state continues to face challenges in administrative

efficiency and service delivery. He informed that the Government of Arunachal Pradesh has constituted a three-member Administrative Reforms Commission with the objective of bringing tangible transformation and modernizing the existing system of governance.

Deputy Commissioner, Tawang, Namgyal Angmo today convened the District Level Monitoring Committee meeting to review the progress and achievements of developmental projects in Tawang district. Under the National Tuberculosis Elimination Programme, two alumni of RKSM, Khonsa, namely Sonali Debroy and Er. Roikim Taikam today adopted eleven TB patients. Under the Nikshay Mitras initiative, food baskets were distributed to the adopted patients at General Hospital Khonsa. In the meantime, DMO, Dr. B. Ratan on behalf of the National Tuberculosis Elimination Programme and the Health Department has conveyed sincere gratitude to Sonali Debroy and Er. Roikim Taikam.

The Centre for Earth Sciences and Himalayan Studies, in collaboration with the National Centre for Polar and Ocean Research and North Eastern Regional Institute of Science and Technology (NERIST) have successfully completed the 5th Khangri Glacier Expedition in the transboundary Mago Chu Basin of Tawang district; a critical headwater region of the larger Brahmaputra Basin system. The scientific expedition had commenced on 4th May with the objective of undertaking detailed glacier health assessments, cryo-spheric monitoring, and climate-linked hazard investigations in the eastern Himalayan region.

The collected datasets will contribute towards understanding extreme weather dynamics, hydrological responses, and glacier-linked climate interactions in the region. The District Police, Lower Subansiri and the Galo Welfare Society, Ziro Unit jointly organized a voluntary blood donation camp today at the Blood Centre, Gyati Takka Zonal General Hospital, Ziro. The initiative was a part of the Pan Arunachal Voluntary Blood Donation Programme to honour the 7th Death Anniversary of former President of the GWS Ziro Unit, Late Dr. Minge Loyi.

Dakyir Basar from Leparada district has clinched the Gold Medal in the Under-42 Kg Junior Female Taekwondo Kyorugi category held in Wangdi Indoor Stadium, Rupa. She has also been conferred the championship's highest individual honor – Best Kyorugi Female Athlete. In response to the achievement, MLA Nyabi Jini Dirchi in a social media post congratulated Dakyir for once again bringing laurels to Leparada District and the entire state of Arunachal Pradesh. Last year, dakyir had represented Arunachal Pradesh at the national level and won Gold.
